FRUIT TREES

All Fruit Trees are Bareroot stock. (1)

(100) Crimson Crisp (malus domestica): Semi-Dwarf

Zone 5-8 : Beautiful blushed red, creamy white flesh is crunchy & juicy. Tart & sweet.

(101) Gale Gala (malus domestica) Semi-Dwarf

Zone 5-8: .Is the “one-pick” Gala strain, has deeper red stripes and a fuller red color.

(102) Lapin Cherry (prunus avium): Semi-Dwarf

Zone 5-8: Large, mahogany-red cherry, sweet & juicy. Self-fertile. Fruit sets heavy on the limb.

(103) Early Italian Plum (prunus cocomilia): Semi-Dwarf

Zone 5-9: Large oval purple fruit. Greenish-yellow flesh. European variety. Semi-self fertile. Does benefits from cross pollination.

(104) Hardired Nectarine (prunus persica): Semi-Dwarf

Zone 4-9: Scarlet round fruit with yellow flesh. Ripens in early August. Resistant to brown rot & bacterial leaf spot.

BERRIES

(105) Prelude Raspberry (Rubus): 3 per bundle.

Zone-4-8: The earliest ripening red raspberry, good flavor. Ripe starting in mid June, lighter crop is produced in fall. Berries are large, round & firm. Vigorous canes.

(106)Polana Raspberry (Rubus): 3 per bundle.

Zone 3-8: Highly productive everbearing raspberry, main crop in late July & August. Lighter crop in fall. Flavorful medium to large red fruit.

SHRUBS/PERENNIALS/TREES

(107) Showy Townsend Daisy: 2 per bundle.

Zone 3-9: 10-Cubic inch plugs. Boasts vibrant purple daisy-like flowers. Full sun, well drained soil. Deadhead to promote prolonged flowering.

(108) Swamp Milkweed (Asclepias incarnata): 2 per bundle.

Zone 3-6: 10-Cubic inch plugs. Attractive to bees, hummingbirds & butterflies. Pink to purple cluster flowers. Sun to part shade, likes water.

(109) Blue Columbine (Aquilegia caerulea): 2 per bundle.

Zone 3-9: 10-Cubic inch plugs. Sun or part shade. 1-3' bushy plant with bright green leaves. Blue to purple with white flowers.

(110) Palmers Penstemon (Penstemon palmeri): 2 per bundle.

Zone 4-9: 10-Cubic inch plugs. Drought tolerant, flowers white to pink. Full sun, 2-4' tall. Blooms May through June.

(111) Showy Fleabane (Erigeron speciosus): 2 per bundle

Zone 4-7: 10.-Cubic inch plugs. Flowers are purple with yellow center. 1-3' tall. Full sun, deer resistant. Drought tolerant.

(112) Desert Globemallow (Sphaeralcea ambigua): 2 per bundle

Zone 7-9: 10-Cubic inch plugs. Drought tolerant. Full sun. Orange-red-apricot flowers, 3'tall.

(113) Mt. Huckleberry (Vaccinium membranaceum): 2 per bundle

Zone 4-8: 20-Cubic inch plugs. Flavorful black to purple fruit. Requires moist, well-drained, acidic soil and lots of sun.

(114) Quaking Aspen (Populus tremuloides): 2 per bundle

Zone 2-6: 10-Cubic inch plugs. Not drought tolerant, mature height to 30'. Full sun or part shade. Best used in groupings. Leaves 3", rounded heart shaped, quiver in the breeze. Golden yellow color in fall. Habitat in many soil types, sandy to gravelly slopes, stream banks to mountain slopes.



Fire-resistant does not mean fireproof!

Even fire-resistant plants will burn if not well maintained. Be sure to keep all of your landscape plants healthy with appropriate watering, proper pruning etc.

REFORESTATION TREES

Sold as bundles.

(115)Western Larch (Larix occidentalis): 10-per bundle.

(116)Zone 3: 5-Cubic inch plugs. Large, straight tree to 100 feet or more. Deciduous conifer with soft light-green needles that turn yellow and drop in the fall. Appears dead in winter. Habitat is mountain slopes and valleys on porous, gravelly, sandy and loamy soils. Full sun to part shade. Needs more moisture. Native

(116) Ponderosa Pine (Pinus ponderosa): 10-per bundle.

Zone 3: 5-Cubic inch plugs. Our Inland Northwest's signature tree. Long-lived, grows to 100 feet or more plus fast growing. Needles 6 inches or longer, cones 3-4 inches, . Important timber and wildlife tree. Habitat is mostly mountains , dry sites. Native.

(117) Coffee Burlap Bags 1 Bag.

Repurposed burlap bags, to cover bedding plants for weed control and other uses. Varies in size.

(118) Biodegradable Tree Reforestation Tubes, with 2 stakes, available for order \$1.75 each. Only for use on reforestation trees.
