FRUIT TREES

All Fruit Trees are Bareroot stock. (1)

(100) Gale Gala (malus domestica): Semi-Dwarf

Zone 5-9 : Is the "one-pick" Gala strain, has deeper red stripes and a fuller red color.

(101) Royal Red Honeycrisp (malus domestica) Semi-Dwarf

Zone 3-9: A new blush-type selection of Honeycrisp with the same flavor and texture with a better color and storage.

(102) Bing Cherry (prunus avium): Semi-Dwarf

Zone 5-8: No. 1 dark sweet cherry. Fruit is dark mahogany, glossy skin & dense, juicy flesh. Large and flavorful.

(103) Rainier Cherry (prunus avium): Semi-Dwarf

Zone 5-8: Named after Mount Rainier. Sweet with a thin skin and thick creamy-yellow flesh.

(104) Redhaven Peach (prunus persica): Semi-Dwarf

Zone 5-9: An early bearing peach. Flesh is firm and yellow texture. Excellent for canning and shipping.

(105) Wenatchee Moorpark Apricot (prunus ameniaca): Semi -Dwarf

Zone 5-9: A large yellow fruit with greenish-yellow flesh. Good for drying & canning. Self-fruitful.

BERRIES

(106) Honeoye strawberry : 10 per bundle.

Zone-3-8: June bearing. Full to part shade, Self Fertile. Winter hardiness, high productivity. Bright color large berry's

(107)Quinault strawberry: 10 per bundle.

Zone 4-9: Disease resistance, large soft berries 2" wide. Cold tolerant. Self fertile. Everbearing.

SHRUBS/PERENNIALS/TREES

(108) Blue Columbine (aquilegia caerulea): 2 per bundle.

Zone 3-9: 10-Cubic inch plugs. Showy blue or blue white flowers in spring, early summer. Full to part sun.

(109) Firecracker Penstemon (penstemon eatonii): 2 per bundle.

Zone 3: Perennial for dry, sunny areas. Green leathery leaves with red or coral tube-shaped blooms. Deer resistant.

(110) Woods Rose (rosa woodsi): 2 per bundle.

Zone 3-8: 10-Cubic inch plugs. Pink flowers, sun or part shade. Mature height 3'.

(111) Prairie Smoke (geum triflorum): 2 per bundle

Zone 3-10: 10.-Cubic inch plugs. Color red, with a fluffy pink seed head. Full sun.

(112) Blanket Flower (galliardia aristata): 2 per bundle

Zone 3-10: 10-Cubic inch plugs. Drough tolerant. Full sun. Deep red blooms, dense foliage. Butterflies love the blooms.

(113) <u>Blue Elderberry (sambucus cerulea):</u> 2 per bundle

Zone 2-9: 10-Cubic inch plugs. Full sun or partial shade. Light purple or blue berries. White or yellow flowers.

(114) Pacific Willow (salix lasiandra): 2 per bundle

Zone 5-9: 10-Cubic inch plugs. Not drought tolerant, mature height to 50'. Full sun. Habitat is wet soils, along streams, lakes or roadsides.

REFORESTATION TREES

(115) Western Larch (Larix occidentalis): 5-per bundle.

Zone 3: 5-Cubic inch plugs. Large, straight tree to 100 feet or more. Deciduous conifer with soft light-green needles that turn yellow and drop in the fall. Appears dead in winter. Habitat is mountain slopes and valleys on porous, gravely, sandy and loamy soils. Full sun to part shade. Needs more moisture. Native

(116) Ponderosa Pine (Pinus ponderosa): 10-per bundle.

Zone 3: 5-Cubic inch plugs. Our Inland Northwest's signature tree. Long-lived, grows to 100 feet or more plus fast growing. Needles 6 inches or longer, cones 3-4 inches, . Important timber and wildlife tree. Habitat is mostly mountains, dry sites. Native.

(117) Coffee Burlap Bags 1 Bag.

Repurposed burlap bags, to cover bedding plants for weed control and other uses. Varies in size.

(118) Biodegradable Tree Reforestation Tubes, with 2
