Proposed project for VSP Capital Funding: Big Goosmus Fire Recovery District
Implemented Project (DIP)

Details: NRCS Range Planting (Code 550) EQIP Payment Rate for Ferry County:
\$406.80/Acre for Native Grass Broadcast. The design life is

Funding: The Washington State Conservation Commission (SCC) has made \$40,000 in capital funding available to Ferry County if it meets the minimum requirements for a VSP capital project. The project would be broken down into:

Technical Assistance: 25% = \$10,000

73.74 Acres of Range Reseeding (NRCS 550) = \$30,000

Description: The Goosmus fire started on 9/25/2024 and was contained on 10/5/24. The total acres burned were 1,738, with the majority of that on grazing land and timber. The Ferry Conservation District (FCD) created a District Implemented Project (DIP) for affected landowners to replant trees and reseed range. The FCD received funding from the Department of Natural Resources to replant trees in a portion of the burned area. The capital VSP funding will be a start on the range reseeding. The NRCS practice standard is attached.
