FRUIT TREES

All Fruit Trees are Bareroot stock. (1)

(100) Gibson Golden (malus domestica): Semi-Dwarf

Zone 4-8 : It has a sweet, crisp flavor. Perfect for eating, baking and making applesauce or cider.

(101) Crimson Crisp (malus domestica): Semi-Dwarf

Zone 4-8: Is a disease-resistant variety, deep red skin and crisp, sweet-tart flavor. Medium sized apple. Scab-free variety.

(102) Snowdrift Crabapple (malus snowdrift): Semi-Dwarf

Zone 4-8: White flowers, very attractive to bees. Blooms mid to late season.

(103) Granny Smith Apple (malus domestica): Semi-Dwarf

Zone 5-9: Its tart, crisp and juicy flavor with a firm texture.

(104) Skeena Cherry (prunus avium): Semi-Dwarf

Zone 5-8: Needs full sun, at lease 6-8 hours. Has large and very firm fruit and dark red flesh and dark red to black skin. Sweet flavor.

(105) Stanley Prune (prunus domestica): Semi-Dwarf

Zone 5-7: Dark blue plum. Yellow/green flesh. Harvest when summer turns to fall when the fruit turns to a dark blue color.

VEGETABLES

Sold as bundle of 5. (5)

(106) Jersey Asparagus (asparagus officinallis):

Zone-8-11: Tolerant of most soils, even clay. Excellent yields, little to no seed production. Good disease resistance.

(107) Purple Passion Asparagus (asparagus officinallis):

Zone 4-8: 20% more sugars than other varieties. Late growth

SHRUBS/PERENNIALS/TREES

Sold as bundle of 2. (2)

(108) Showy Milkweed (asclepias speciosa):

Zone 4-9: 10-Cubic inch plugs. Moderate drought tolerant, dusty pink/rose flowers. Full sun, deer resistant. Height of 1 1/2–3 feet. Bees, butterflies and hummingbirds love it.

(109) Taper Leaf Penstemon (penstemon attenuatus):

Zone 3-9: 10.-Cubic inch plugs. Flowers are pale blue to purple. 12"-24" tall. Thrives in various habitats. Attracts a variety of pollinators.

(110) Western Mt Ash (sorbus scopulina):

Zone 2-6: 10-Cubic inch plugs. Flowers are small and white, Fruit is glossy, orange and berry-like. Grows on rocky hillsides, open woods and along streams.

(111) Evergreen Huckleberry (vaccinium ovatum):

Zone 7-9 20-Cubic inch plugs. Prefer cool moist winter, dry summers, and partial shade or full sun. 3-8 ' tall. Great for smoothies, fruit bowls, desserts and jams & jellies and wildlife.

(112) Western Paper Birch (betula papyrifera):

Zone 2-6: 20-Cubic inch plugs. Not drought hardy. Mature height to 80'. Fast growing, benefits birds and mammals. Used for riparian and reforestation. Best if planted in groves.

Fire-resistant does not mean fireproof!



Even fire-resistant plants will burn if not well maintained. Be sure to keep all of your landscape plants healthy with appropriate watering, proper pruning etc.

REFORESTATION TREES

Sold as bundles of 10. (10)

(113) Western Larch (larix occidentalis):

Zone 3: 5-Cubic inch plugs. Large, straight tree to 100 feet or more. Deciduous conifer with soft light-green needles that turn yellow and drop in the fall. Appears dead in winter. Habitat is mountain slopes and valleys on porous, gravelly, sandy and loamy soils. Full sun to part shade. Needs more moisture. Native

(114) Douglas Fir (pseudotsuga menziesii):

Zone 4-7: 5-Cubic inch plugs. Used extensively as Christmas Trees. It needs a well-drained soil for best growth and can reach mature height of over 100' Mature Douglas-fir is a relatively fire-resistant tree.

(115) Coffee Burlap Bags: 1 Bag.

Repurposed burlap bags, to cover bedding plants for weed control and other uses. Varies in size.

(116) Biodegradable Tree Reforestation Tubes: 1 tube, 2 stakes

Comes with 2 stakes, available for order \$1.75 each. Only for use on reforestation trees.
